NEW MULTI-USE PATHWAY

FOR YOUR INFORMATION --

Waterton Lakes National Park will soon be offering a new paved trail for cyclists, pedestrians, disabled visitors and others to enjoy the Waterton Valley and safely travel between the park gate and the community. It will be named the 'Kootenai Brown Trail'.

The pathway will link the community and Townsite Campground to picnic areas and scenic viewpoints in the Waterton Valley. It will also provide 8 km of safe trail access for visitors to experience exceptional views 'Where the Mountains Meet the Prairie'. We expect construction of the pathway will begin in early June and end in September.

The current Entrance Parkway is a two-lane highway with very narrow shoulders. Cyclists and pedestrians using this road travel in close proximity to vehicles, creating a potential safety hazard.

Environmental considerations relating to maintenance of fescue prairie and species at risk have been fully considered in the routing and design of the pathway. The pathway is largely located within the disturbed area created by parkway reconstruction in the late 1980s.

Parks Canada is committed to providing quality facilities and opportunities for visitors to have real and inspiring park experiences.
